



Who can participate?

Foreign nationals and **EU citizens** of 3-15 years of age whose parents / guardians have received a notification from the Police and Border Guard Board on enrolment in the programme are welcome to take part in the trainings.

Parents / guardians of those 3-15 year-olds who have received no such notification but whose child has legally resided in Estonia for less than five years and wishes to participate, can request enrolment in the programme by sending a letter of application to the Police and Border Guard Board. Why to participate?

After completing the training module, the child or young person will know:

- where to find additional information about Estonia's history, geography and nature;
- the traditions and customs of Estonians;
- how to compare the cultural specifics of their country of origin and Estonia and will have an overview about possibilities for spending their free time in Estonia.

The training will also be an opportunity to make new friends and acquaintances.

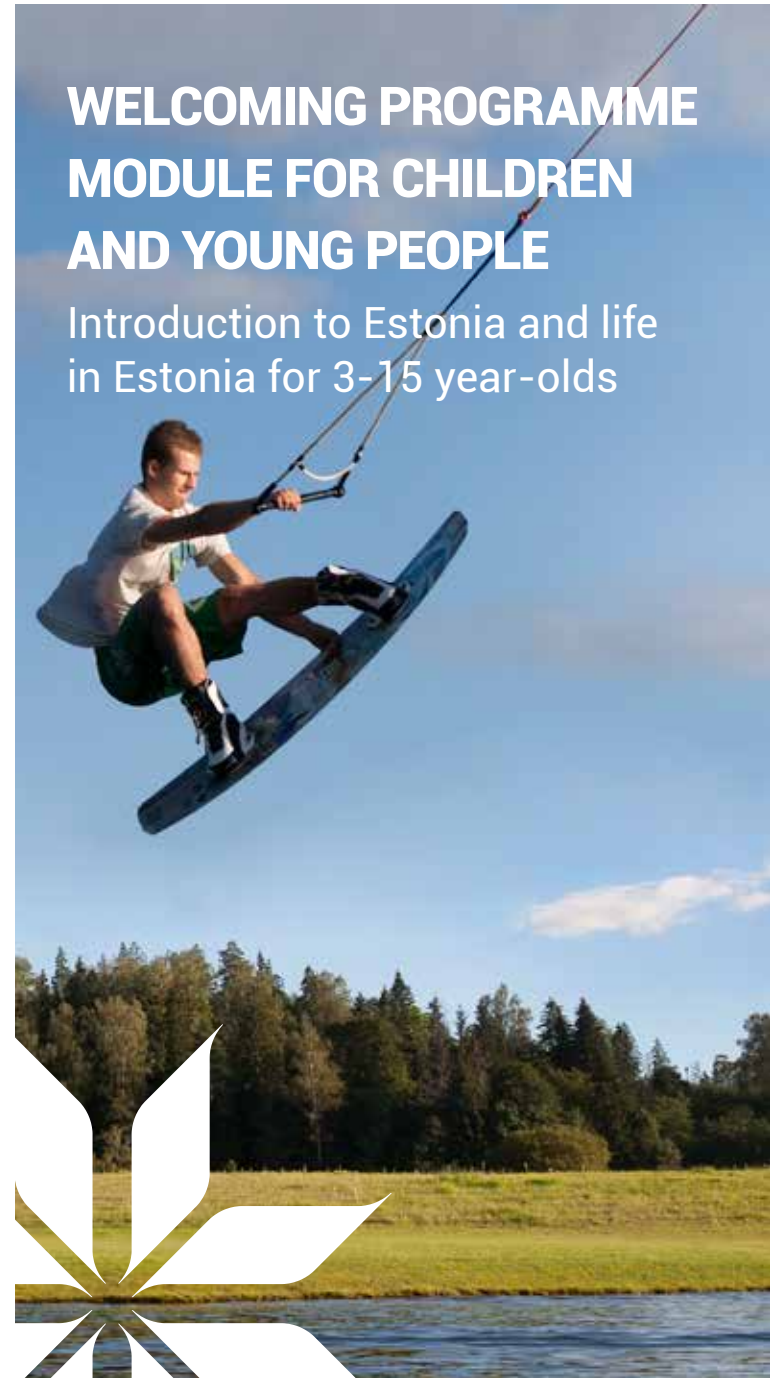

What is welcoming programme?

The purpose of the Welcoming Programme is to support your migration and subsequent integration in Estonia. The programme consists of modules: basics, work and entrepreneurship, study, science, family life and children and youth, international protection and basic language training (A1 level). Content of the children and young people module

In the course of the training, main topics will be discussed that children and young people arriving in Estonia could benefit from knowing in order to accommodate to Estonian society.

The following topics will be discussed, among others:

- Estonia's history, geography, nature
- Traditions and customs of Estonians
- Specifics of Estonian culture
- Estonian learning culture
- Recreational habits and opportunities of Estonian children and young people

- Involvement of young people in the society
- Rights of children
- Opportunities to get help in an emergency
- Legal prohibitions and restrictions for children and young people

During the training day, children and young people will, in playful situations:

- explore, discover and experiment
- learn through personal experience and compare Estonia to their country of origin
- actively express their opinion
- find out how their peers live in Estonia

Structure of the training

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
