All foreign nationals and EU citizens who have received a notification from the Police and Border Guard Board on enrolment in the programme are welcome to take part in the trainings.

If you have received no such notification but you have legally resided in Estonia for less than five years and would like to participate in the training, you can request enrolment in the programme by sending a letter of application to the Police and Border Guard Board. Why to participate?

After completing work and entrepreneurship module, you will have received information about:

- Finding and changing employment (incl in broader EU);
- Rights and obligations of the employers and employees and about Estonian work culture
- Estonian pension system
- Possibilities for additional training and starting a company.

The training will also introduce possibilities to join associations for entrepreneurs or specialists and various work and entrepreneurship related services available for foreigners residing in Estonia.

WELCOMING PROGRAMME WORKING AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP MODULE

What is welcoming programme?

The purpose of the Welcoming Programme is to support your migration and subsequent integration in Estonia. The programme consists of modules: basics, work and entrepreneurship, study, science, family life and children and youth, international protection and basic language training (A1 level). Content of the working and entrepreneurship module

In the course of the training, the most important topics will be discussed that every foreign national migrating to Estonia for work or entrepreneurship could benefit from knowing.

The following topics will be discussed, among the rest:

- The legal bases for living in Estonia
- How to find a suitable job and where to get help with that
- Labour mobility within the European Union
- The labour law, the employee's rights and duties in an employment relationship

- The structure of Estonian tax system
- Employer's rights and obligations
- The fundamentals of unemployment insurance and health insurance
- Estonian work culture
- The structure of Estonian pension system
- Opportunities for in-service training
- Opportunities for starting a business
- The associations of entrepreneurs and top-level specialists in Estonia
- Work-related and business-related services for foreign nationals.

Structure of the training course

The duration of the work and entrepreneurship module is one day (8h) and it includes information sharing by experts as well as directions for finding further info you may need.

The trainings are held in Tallinn, Tartu and Narva. Upon registering for the module, you can choose between English or Russian as the language of instruction. Participation is free of charge. Upon completion of the training, you will receive a digital or, upon request, a hard copy certificate confirming that you have completed the training.
